Study at Unipd

What are entry requirements for being enrolled in Sustainable Agriculture degree program?

Entry requirements are specified in the application platform: https://apply.unipd.it/. A teaching commission will evaluate your CV and educational background and it will give you feedback about eligibility in due time.

Who can help me in filling the documents, assisting me for the study plan, understand how the academic life works, finding graduation dates, etc.?

The University of Padova offers peer-to-peer assistance services to the enrolled students:

You can be assisted by a <u>Tutor Buddy</u>, i.e. a Master's degree student who will welcome and support you during your stay.

Tutor Juniors are students enrolled in single or second cycle degrees, doctoral degrees, who received special training so that they can effectively help you to manage all the aspects of the academic life.

❖ What is the study plan and which exams can I select?

Within each curriculum and study track, courses can be:

- Mandatory: they will be automatically selected by the system.
- Alternative: they will be chosen as alternative each other. The student will have to choose two of these units. The others can be inserted in the study plan as elective course units
- Elective: you are strongly recommended to choose elective courses from those belonging to the field of study based on the chosen curriculum. This guarantees a coherent and well-balanced study plan.





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Surplus credits can also be acquired via optional exams (in addition to the total amount of credits required to obtain your degree qualification), but they do not allow you to acquire higher grades or a different degree title.

Graduation information

What is the final examination?

It consists in the preparation of a thesis and a dissertation before a Graduation Committee. Each student is asked to develop her/his research in agreement with a Reference Professor who will supervise the work. The topic of the research will be chosen based on each student interests in agreement with the Reference Professor expertise and availability.

Students are encouraged to contact directly their professors to learn about the availability of thesis topics.

<u>Keep in mind</u>: Drafting your thesis can take some months (30 credits to be accrued!). Moreover, the administrative process requires some formal steps to be completed by undelayable dates: please check the website of the School of Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine and make sure you have enough time to accurately complete your job. ❖ I want to postpone the date of my graduation. Is it possible?

Yes, you should define with your supervisor if it is necessary, and after that you should follow the steps you can find here.

How to write the thesis?

Please discuss about it with your supervisor and carefully read the info that is here provided.

How to prepare the defense?

You will have 12-15 minutes to present your results to the graduation committee. A power point presentation is used to support your defense where a brief introduction, the methodological approach, the results and your conclusions are reported. There is not a deadline to finalize the presentation before the defense. You will organize the contents with your supervisor.

How is the final graduation grade assigned?

In Italy it is expressed in 110. The highest grade can be 110/110, and it can be attributed with honor. The least grade is 66/110.

It is assigned by summing up:

- Weighted average of the grades of the exams, converted in 110.
- Degree points, that can be in total 9 and are assigned as follows:
 - Judgment of supervisor: from 0 to 3 points.
 - Judgment of an external reviewer*: from 0 to 3 points.
 - Judgment of Thesis Defense Committee: from 0 to 3 points.





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*The external reviewer is **NOT** automatically assigned and is not mandatory. The decision to ask an external reviewer's evaluation is of the supervisor, upon agreement with the student, only if the thesis work is particularly worthwhile. As a rule, the thesis must be ready at least 30 days before the discussion day, so that the Coordinator of the course can send it to the external reviewer, which remains anonymous.

Where to find accommodation?

Public halls of residence are managed by ESU, which is a regional agency in charge of many students' services. Accommodation in those halls of residence is governed by a competition and the results are published in September, which is quite late to start the research in case you would be excluded by the competition and also places are limited, so keep into consideration also private residences.
